Ted W. Miller, CAA - Arizona 2002 Conference Site: San Antonio, TX 23rd NIAAA President

Ted W. Miller, CAA, served as the third person to serve as President from Section VII and the second President to serve as President of the NIAAA from the State of Arizona.

He served the NIAAA as a member of the Credentials Committee for (4) four years and as a State Liaison to the NIAAA from the State of Arizona.

He assumed the presidency of the NIAAA in Orlando, Florida. Throughout his term, one of his goals was to continue to strengthen the partnership between the National Federation and the NIAAA.

Leadership training continued to grow during his term. With (17) seventeen courses in place and (3) three more being introduced at the 2003 Conference. During 2002 more than 5,600 Athletic Administrators took courses. (4) Four course videos were produced to be used in the states for courses presentations.

A leadership training institute was held in Indianapolis in July of 2002. (9) Nine courses were taught in (3) three sessions over 1'/Z days and 168 courses were taken by 60 individuals.

During the year under the direction of John Olsen and Frank Kovaleski, Ohio University partnership with the NIAAA to launch a Master's Degree Program in Athletic Administration, to begin in June of 2003. Eighty percent of the program materials will be in the NIAAA leadership training materials.

The Certification Program continued to flourish with (3) three levels of certification; RAA, CAA and the CMAA.

The website, under the direction of Bruce Whitehead, continued to be updated.

The Endowment Committee raised over \$200,000.00 of their goal of \$500,000.00 which was established by the Strategic Plan.

Of the 41 items in the Strategic Plan, 20 were complied and 18 were in progress during the year and (3) three were yet to be started.
